INFORMATION NEEDED TO OBTAIN CLUB CERTIFICATION LETTER

TO APPLY FOR

SPECIAL INTEREST VEHICLE CONCESSIONAL REGISTRATION

1. Documentation from Main Roads or Registration Authority showing the current engine number and chassis number. Please ensure you know the exact location of these numbers on the actual vehicle to assist with inspection. All documentation must show owner's current details.
2. Documentation or vehicle information indicating year of manufacture of the vehicle (must be 30 years minimum).
3. To cover additional administrative requirements, the Club charges a \$50.00 once only fee per vehicle. Your Invoice will be attached with this document if you have indicated you wish to apply for Conditional Registration.
4. Please find following Queensland Transport Special Regulations that apply to Concessional Registration of your vehicle. Please read these regulations carefully. Substantial penalties and loss of concessional registration privileges apply if conditions are contravened.
5. Please allow ample time for the club to receipt your funds and then call Membership Secretary, Graeme Adams, on 0407 565628 to arrange an inspection appointment to be carried out at 54 Neptune Circuit Noosaville. Under some circumstances, e.g. multiple vehicles, Inspection may be specially organised at your premises if within reasonable travelling distance.
6. A separate application form and payment of inspection fee for each vehicle must be completed before Inspection is made and Certificate issued.

QUEENSLAND TRANSPORT SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR CONCESSIONAL VEHICLE REGISTRATION

Special conditions apply when vehicles have been concessionally registered. Registered Operators must meet these requirements at the application for concessional registration and continue to comply with these conditions when using their vehicles.

The special conditions are:

Club Membership

Registered Operators are expected to be members of a car club or association. Evidence of current membership must be provided by the club or association when applying. Where a genuine reason is provided for not meeting this condition, it may be waived by Queensland Transport.

Dating Certificate

The vehicle will need to be inspected by a club official of a car club or association to certify the vehicle was manufactured at least 30 years ago. This certificate, which must be on official club documentation, will need to be presented when applying for concessional registration.

Lighting

If the vehicle doesn't have permanent lighting, then a removable lighting system must be carried with the vehicle at all times to use when lighting is required. Carbide lights are acceptable if that type of light was originally fitted.

Restricted vehicle use

Registered Operators must agree they will confine their vehicles use to:

- participating in rallies organised by properly constituted car clubs
- participating in processions for which a Special Event Permit has been issued under the Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Regulation 1995
- exhibiting the vehicle in displays, fetes or similar functions conducted for religious, charitable or educational purposes
- ceremonial purposes involving immediate family members, for example weddings or school formals, (immediate family means parents or carers and their dependants only and generally does not refer to extended family relationships, such as nephews and nieces,) provided no fee is charged
- preparing for, proceeding to and returning from the above activities
- vehicles are not permitted to carry a load except in circumstances where the load is part of a display which directly relates to the authenticity of the vehicle, e.g. hay bales or empty drums
- road testing within a 15 km radius from where the vehicle is garaged
- travel in order to have the vehicle repaired. No distance restriction applies in these circumstances but it must be reasonable and openly justifiable.

If a Special Interest Vehicle is being used for any other purpose, the registered operator needs to either upgrade to full registration or carry a letter of authorisation for that particular use from Queensland Transport.

Please remember Concessional Registration is a privilege usually only offered to financial car club members.

Members should ensure they are familiar with the regulations for use of Concessional registered vehicles and carry their club membership card when using the vehicle.

If used improperly your vehicle may be regarded as unregistered and therefore will not be covered by any insurance.
